Nunavut Fact Sheet

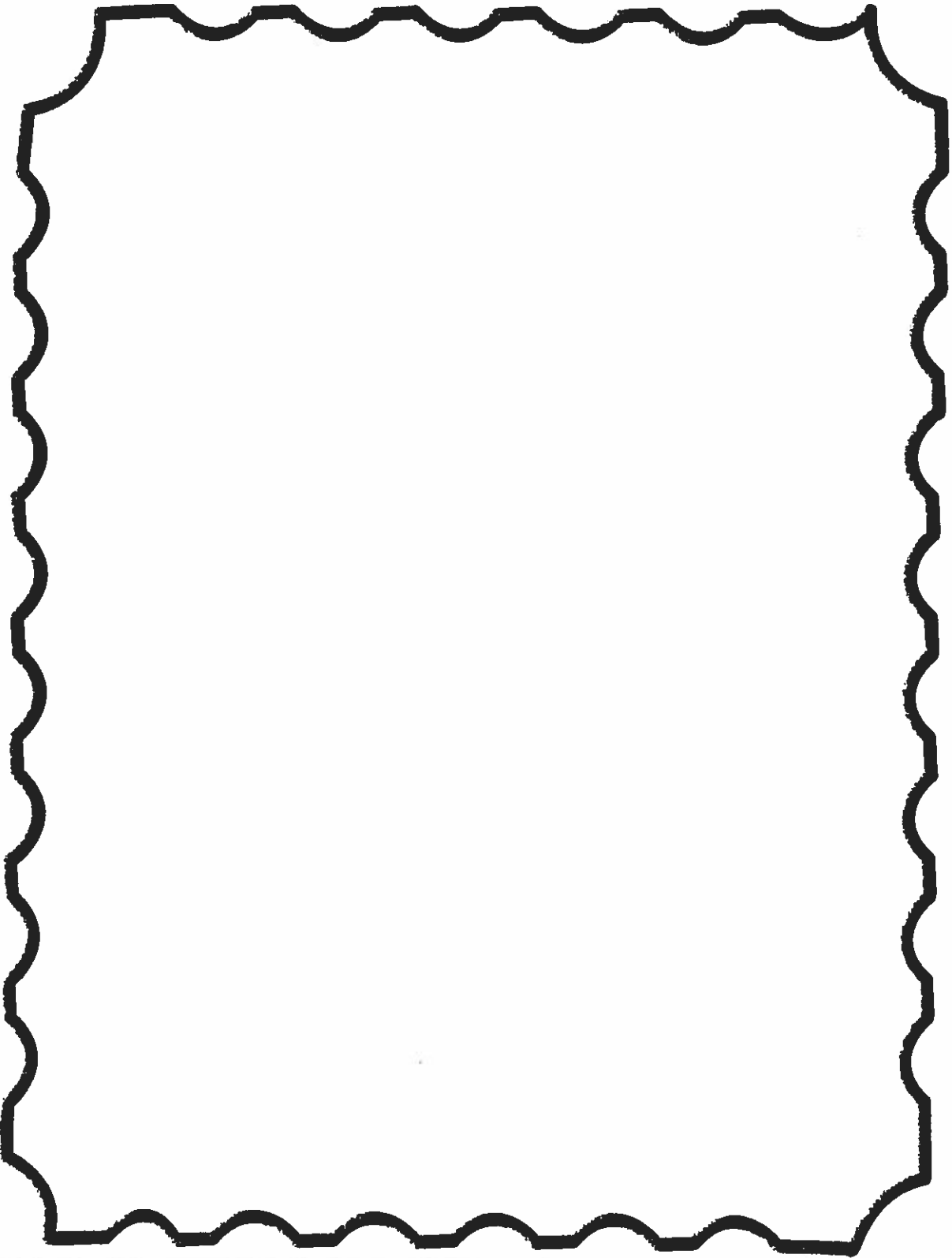

- Nunavut means *our land* in the Inuit language.
 - After April 1, 1999, all maps of Canada had to be redrawn to include Nunavut.
 - Establishing this territory settled one of the largest land claims in Canadian history. Nunavut occupies 2 million square kilometres — about 1/5 of Canada's total land mass.
 - There are three geographic regions in Nunavut; Qikiqtaaluk, Kivallik (formerly known as Baffin and Keewatin), and Kitikmeot.
 - The capital city is Iqaluit, population 4500.
 - Nunavut has 28 communities of which Iqaluit is the largest.
 - The population of the territory is 85% Inuit.
- The Inuit are an aboriginal people. *Inuit* means *people* in the Inuit language, Inuktitut. The singular of *Inuit* is *Inuk*.
 - The settlement gives the Inuit guaranteed participation in decisions on land and resource use and management.
 - Reserves of copper, gold, silver, lead, zinc, and diamonds are known to exist there.
 - The government has an elected legislative assembly, a cabinet, and a territorial court similar to the Yukon and the Northwest Territories.
 - Three new national parks are planned for Nunavut.
